

Saul Alinsky – The Method

What is a "Community Organizer"?

- Euphemism for a radical activist
- Alinsky was a community organizer
- Alinsky was from Russia, friends with Frank Nitti and Al Capone and studied their methods for organizing unions.
- Wrote <u>Rules for Radicals</u>, the "Bible for Community Organizers". Book dedicated to Lucifer "the original rebel"
- Purpose of the Alinsky Method
 - Goal is bottom up change in the social order
 - To work within the system to get to what he calls "revolution"

Prologue from Radicals



"As an organizer I start from where the world is, as it is, not as I would like it to be...it is necessary to begin where the world is if we are going to change it to what we think it should be. That means working in the system...Any revolutionary change must be preceded by passive, affirmative, non-challenging attitude toward change among the mass of our people. They must feel so frustrated, so defeated, so lost, so futureless in the prevailing system that they are willing to let go of the past and chance the future. This acceptance is the reformation necessary to any revolution." (i.e. – a crisis is necessary to get the populace to accept massive change)

More from Rules for Radicals

- "A revolutionary organizer must shake up the prevailing power of their lives – agitate, create disenchantment and discontent with the current values, to produce, if not a passion for change, at least a passive, affirmative, non-challenging climate."
- "[The people] don't know what will work, but they do know that the prevailing system is selfdefeating, frustrating and hopeless. They won't act for change, but won't strongly oppose those who do. The time is then ripe for revolution.

Yet More

- "Lenin was a pragmatist; when he returned to what was then Petrograd from exile, he said the Bolsheviks stood for getting power through the ballot, but would reconsider after they got the guns." (from Rules for Radicals)
- Alinsky's rules encourage lying to gain power via stealth and other techniques, then once power is secured, do whatever it takes to consolidate power, including violence.

The Stated Purpose of <u>Rules for Radicals</u>

- "What follows is for those who want to change the world from what it is to what they believe it should be. <u>The Prince</u> was written by Machiavelli for the Haves (sic) on how to hold power. Rules for Radicals is written for the <u>Have-Nots</u> (sic) on how to take it away."
- "In this book we are concerned with how to create mass organizations to seize power...This means revolution."

Opening paragraph of <u>Rules for Radicals</u>

Barack Obama: Alinsky Style Community Organizer

- Obama worked for several organizations founded by Saul Alinsky or his followers
 - First job worked for Industrial Areas Foundation teaching Saul Alinsky's methods.
 - The Industrial Areas Foundation (IAF) is a Chicago-based community organizing network established in 1940 by Saul Alinsky to "build organizations whose primary purpose is power - the ability to act - and whose chief product is social change."
 - Worked for four years as a community organizer and as director of the Developing Communities Project in Chicago
 - "In theory, community organizing provides a way to merge various strategies for neighborhood empowerment. Organizing begins with the premise that (1) the problems facing inner-city communities do not result from a lack of effective solutions, but from a lack of power to implement these solutions; (2) that the only way for communities to build long-term power is by organizing people and money around a common vision; and (3) that a viable organization can only be achieved if a broadly based indigenous leadership — and not one or two charismatic leaders — can knit together the diverse interests of their local institutions."

 - Project ACORN
 - Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now
 - Voter registration, subprime mortgages, lobbying congress
 - Obama taught their leadership courses and served as their legal counsel
 - Project VOTE
 - Obama worked for them for seven months

Reveille for Radicals (p214-220)

- Alinsky was a white Russian communist who appeals to blacks to organize their communities for the purpose of changing the social order:
 - "The nation desperately needs the organized power of our black sector and its representatives"
 - Give them hope. "the hopeless don't revolt, because revolution is an act of hope".
 - He appeals to blacks to foment change: "Black culture without power is castration...We must have more black organizers who will do the job"
 - The social changers go by many names: agitators, revolutionaries, catalysts, and "outside trouble makers..."the generation gap".

"Reveille for Radicals" (p214-235) Alinsky's Second book

- "By refusing to begin with the world as it is and to build power instruments for change, the [radicals seeking change] have reacted with a disorganized, almost anarchistic approach."
- "Change can only be effected through power, and power means organization. Organization can only be built around issues that are specific, immediate and realizable...Change means movement." If the people feel hopeless in the face of crisis, they will follow those who offer change.
- We must "distinguish between the world as it is and the world as we would like it to be."
- We must then organize the minorities, but "we still need allies for the necessary power for change. These allies can come only from the organized sectors of the middle class".

Cloward-Piven – The Strategy



 Richard Andrew Cloward and Francis Fox Piven are two names that are largely unfamiliar to the average American, but, <u>as Jason</u> Brown notes,

their historical relevance is being seen all over the country today as we watch civil unrest in the form of riots ensue.

Collapse the Welfare State

- At Columbia University, sociologist professors Richard Cloward and Francis Fox Piven introduced a political strategy in 1966 in an article entitled <u>'The Weight Of The Poor: A Strategy To End Poverty'</u>.
- This article outlined a plan that they believed **would eventually lead to the total transmutation of America into a full-fledged centralized welfare state** (in other words, a collectivist enclave). The spearpoint of the Cloward-Piven strategy involved nothing less than economic sabotage against the U.S.
- Theoretically, according to the doctrine, a condition of overwhelming tension and strain could be engineered through the overloading of American welfare rolls, thereby smothering the entitlement program structure at the state and local level. The implosion of welfare benefits would facilitate a massive spike in poverty and desperation, creating a financial crisis that would lead to an even greater cycle of demand for a fully socialized system. This desperation would then "force" the federal government to concentrate all welfare programs under one roof, nationalize and enforce a socialist ideology, and ultimately, compact an immense level of power into the hands of a select few.

- In the mid-sixties at the height of the "social revolution" the line between democratic benevolence and outright communism became rather blurry. The Democratic Party, which controlled the presidency and both houses of Congress, was used as the springboard by social engineers to introduce a new era of welfare initiatives enacted in the name of "defending the poor", also known as the "Great Society Programs". These initiatives, however, were driven by far more subversive and extreme motivations, and have been expanded on by every presidency since, Republican and Democrat alike.




Dividing Religion and The Bible

John Dewey "Father of Modern Education"

- "I am convinced that the battle for humankind's future must be waged and won in the public school classroom by teachers that correctly perceive their role as proselytizers of a new faith: a religion of humanity...The classroom must and will become an arena of conflict between the old and new—the rotting corpse of Christianity, together with all its adjacent evils and misery, and the new faith of humanism, resplendent with the promise of a world in which the never-realized Christian ideal of 'love thy neighbor' will finally be achieved."
 - excerpt from an article by John Dunphy titled "A Religion for a New Age", appearing in the January/February 1983 issue of "The Humanist" magazine.




John Dewey


- 1899 "School and Society"
- Praised the educational system in Russia
- A self-acknowledged anti-capitalist
- A self-acknowledged anti-Christian
- Signer of the Humanist Manifesto
 - May have written the Humanist Manifesto
- Founding member of the ACLU

Dividing Science and the Bible

Science and the Bible

- Louis Pasteur
 - 1852 proved link between bacteria and disease
 - Destroyed "theory of spontaneous generation"
- Isaac Newton
 - "I seek for laws, because I am convinced that there is a Lawgiver."
 - Wrote over one million words of theology.





Charles Darwin

- Son of a minister
- Wrote Origin of Species, 1859
 - Response to Louis Pasteur
- Result: Genesis no longer trusted.



Clarence Darrow

- Great Trial Attorney
- Atheist Son of an Agnostic **Unitarian Minister**
- 1925 Defended John T. Scopes
 - Can Evolution be taught in the public schools?
 - Lost the case
 - Won the war
- Founding member of the ACLU

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
The Founders' Concern

- James Madison spoke of his concern that one denomination might obtain the preeminence, or two might combine and establish a national religion to which they would compel others to conform.
- These churchmen were not dealing with keeping God out of government; they were trying to ensure that no state's denomination would become the state church of the United States.



The Text of the First Amendment

- Representative Fisher Ames proposed:
- "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or denying the free exercise thereof."



Religion is left to the states

- "I consider the government of the U.S. as interdicted (prohibited) by the constitution from intermeddling with religious institutions, their doctrines, discipline, or exercises. This results not only from the provision that no law shall be made respecting the establishment, or free exercise, of religion, but from that also which reserves to the states the powers not delegated to the U.S. (10th Amendment)..."
 - Thomas Jefferson, Jan 23, 1808.

Separation of Church and State

- Phrase not in Bill of Rights
- On January 1, 1802, Jefferson wrote a letter to the Danbury Baptist Association of Danbury, Connecticut to calm their fears that congress was in the process of choosing any one single Christian denomination to be the "state" denomination of the United States of America
- Quoted Baptist preacher, Roger Williams

Jefferson Was Not An Expert


- Jefferson did not sign the Constitution
- Jefferson was not present at the Constitutional Convention of 1787.
- Jefferson was not present when the First Amendment and religious freedom were debated in the first session of Congress in 1789 (he was out of the country as Ambassador to France)
- Therefore, his letter is not a "first-hand" reflection on the intent of the framers.



Jefferson's Interpretation

"In matters of religion, I have considered that its free exercise is placed by the Constitution independent of the powers of the General [Federal] Government. I have therefore undertaken, on no occasion, to prescribe the religious exercise suited to it; but have left them, as the Constitution found them, under the direction and discipline of state and church authorities by the several religious societies."

> March 4, 1805 – Jefferson's Second Inaugural Address:



ACLU and the First Amendment

- "The establishment clause requires the separation of church and state. Assaults on the freedom to believe continue, both in Washington and in state legislatures around the country. The ACLU will continue working to ensure that religious liberty is protected by keeping the government out of the religion business."

 - Fear of communist revolution in the USA
 - Italian suicide bomber in congress

- ACLU Founded in Response to Raids





Agnes Smedley

- Whittaker Chambers identified her as a Communist Party Member
- On 1st January 1948, the Chicago Tribune carried a story claiming that Smedley was being investigated as part of communist espionage ring based in Japan during the 1930s. The article claimed that Smedley was working with the German journalist, Richard Sorge, who was spying on the Japanese government on behalf of the Soviet Union.



Roger Baldwin

- Director of ACLU for thirty years
- "I am for Socialism, disarmament, and, ultimately, for abolishing the State itself as an instrument of violence and compulsion. I seek the social ownership of property, the abolition of the propertied class and sole control of those who produce wealth. Communism is the goal."

His Strategy

"Do steer away from making it [the People's Council] look like a Socialist enterprise. Too many people have already gotten the idea that it is nine-tenths a Socialist movement.... 
